

Year In Review

FALL 2004

The Fall 2004 season started off on a positive note as our U10 through U14 teams dominated the local leagues in girls and boys divisions.

We traveled to Columbus for the OP Invitational, to Canton, Michigan for the Global Soccer Tournament, and to Indiana for the FC Pride Cup. We then finished off the season with our own Season Finale with overall excellent results.

All of our U15-U18 players joined us for the indoor season after their successful high school seasons. Once again, our members dominated the high school scene. Walsh captured the 2004 Division I State Championship while Hathaway Brown won the DII Title. The following 2004 State Champs are members of our club: Walsh – Rose Augustine, Kathleen Callahan, Tierney Lanich, Roxanne Melchorie, Katie Persichini, Liz Secue, and Danielle Vespoli; HB – Chrissy Butler, Courtney Rosen, Hanna Cannepa.

Six of our members earned 2004 All-State and NSCAA High School Regional All-American Honors: Lindsay Bartowski, Renee Hitchcock, Katie Lozar, Courtney Rosen, Hanna Wilde, Corbie Yee. Rosen and Yee also earned NSCAA High School All-American honors. Rosen was then named the DII Ohio High School Player of the Year.

In addition, Jessica Rostedt, Rosen, and Wilde were named to the NSCAA Youth All-American teams in their age groups. Rostedt was also named to the 2004 Parade All-American team.

Our College Alumni were also dominating on the NCAA scene. Eleven of our members helped their teams reach the NCAA tournament and two of them (Mary Boland and Kate Tulisak) were crowned DI National Champions with the U of Notre Dame.

Mallory Mahar had a tremendous year at the U of Maryland. She earned Soccer Buzz All-American and Regional honors, as well as NSCAA Regional Honors and was named to the All-ACC First Team. Tesia Kozlowski, Erin Lustic, and Dee Nocero also earned Regional and Conference Honors.

The fall of 2004 season saw many of our players reach the highest levels of the game. Three of our members competed at the annual Interregional event over the Thanksgiving Holiday: Paige Maxwell, Rosen, and Wilde.

Jessica Rostedt was the only player from Ohio on the 21-woman U.S. roster for the U19 Women's World Championships held in Thailand. In her first major international competition, Rostedt helped lead the team to the bronze medal with 3 goals in group play – tied for third leading goal scorer in the tournament!

The fall ended with a bang as our U14 Girls Super-Y team capped off a great Inaugural Season by capturing the **2004 Super-Y League NATIONAL TITLE** in Orlando! Danielle Hubka was awarded the MVP of the finals for her impressive play throughout the week. The team outscored their opponents 13-3 during the 5 day event.

Spring 2005 proved to be another successful season as we dominated at all levels.

The Northern Ohio Cup, Facesetter Cup, Fever Cup and US Club Soccer Cup and other top-notch tournaments were flooded with our teams in various age groups... our teams successfully competed in each of the events.

Our U16s and U17s gained valuable exposure to college coaches at various college showcase tournaments.

We once again proved why we are the most dominate club in Ohio North by capturing multiple **FIRST PLACE TITLES** at the **2004 Ohio North State Cup**. We entered the Cup with nine teams. Seven teams made it to the State Cup Final Game! We finished with 6 first place titles (U10, 11, 13, 14, 16, 18), and 1 second place trophy (U15). Our U15 and 19s were also granted regional berths.

Our U13s reached the quarterfinals and our U14, 15, 16, 18, and 19 teams competed hard and played well at the Regional Finals in Sioux Falls, SD.

To cap off the summer, a number of our members made an impact at all levels. Many players from our club were named to Ohio-N State Teams while several were named to the Regional Pools.

Rostedt competed at the U20 National Team camp held at the Home Depot National Training Center in Carson, CA in June.

In addition, this summer, marked the second season of our own W-League team. The W-League is the highest level of competition for women in the country and one of the top 3 leagues in the world! We finished second in our division and advanced to the playoffs which placed us in the TOP TEN in the NATION for 2005!!

This year marked the return of one of our most decorated Alumni as Keri Sarver joined our coaching staff on a full-time basis. She has now come full-circle with the club and we welcome her back to OH!
